
Symbolic cheque presentation by the deputy Chinese Ambassador Zhang Yuebang

The activities will be from sports, drama, health, vocational skills, remedial lessons to other areas which the youth would appreciate to learn more about or be engaged in.

She also said the facility will incorporate an Early Child Development (ECD) centre and will be of great value not only to the youth but to the community as a whole.

The donation is under the China-Africa civil partnership which is running across the continent.






FDH SUPPORTS EDUCATION

EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN FARMERS IN DOWA

In DAPP Farmers Club the capacities of farmers are build in many ways - not only by providing agricultural skills. Adult literacy is one the many skills farmers are being offered. The farmers club project has so far seen 139 women taking part in adult learning classes.

They are taught how to write and read. Literacy classes ensure that participating farmers acquire skills which can assist them in developing their business.

The project has also 350 commitee members on six food groups which aims at providing skills in women on how to prepare and process food so that they don't lose essential nutrients.

After the training each of the committee members will pass on the knowledge to 9 other farmers in her club and in this way all 3,500 farmers will learn about how to make a balanced diet and how to prepare nutritious food.
